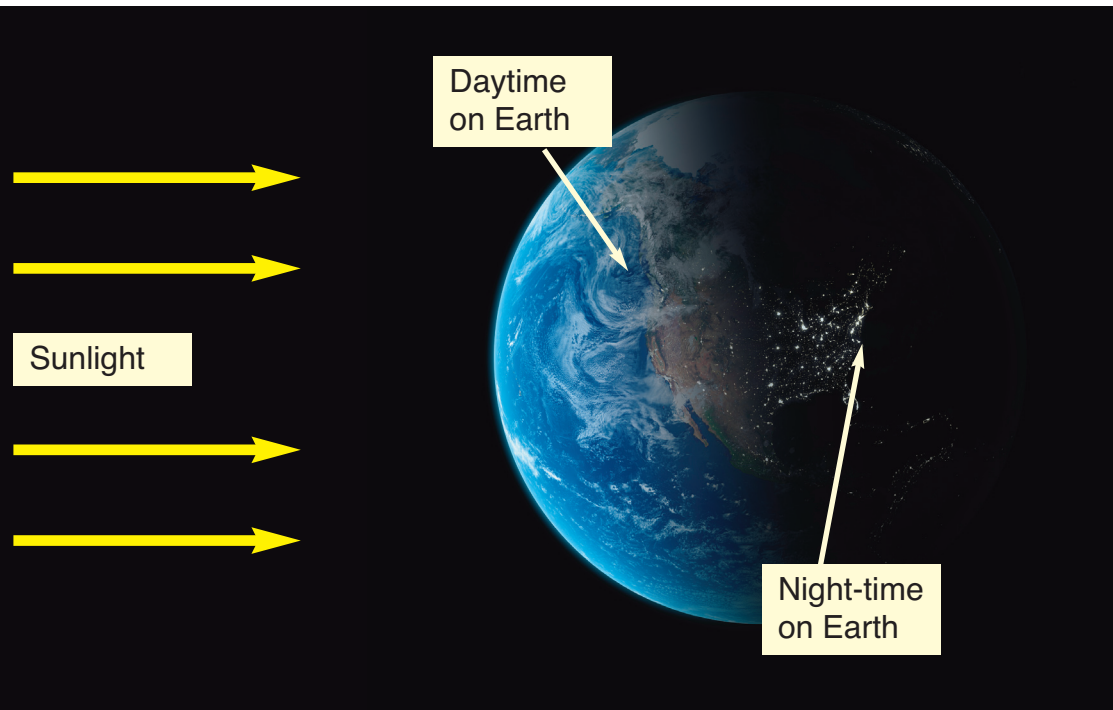

At the top and bottom of planet Earth (near the North and South Poles) it can be day-time all the time or night-time all the time.

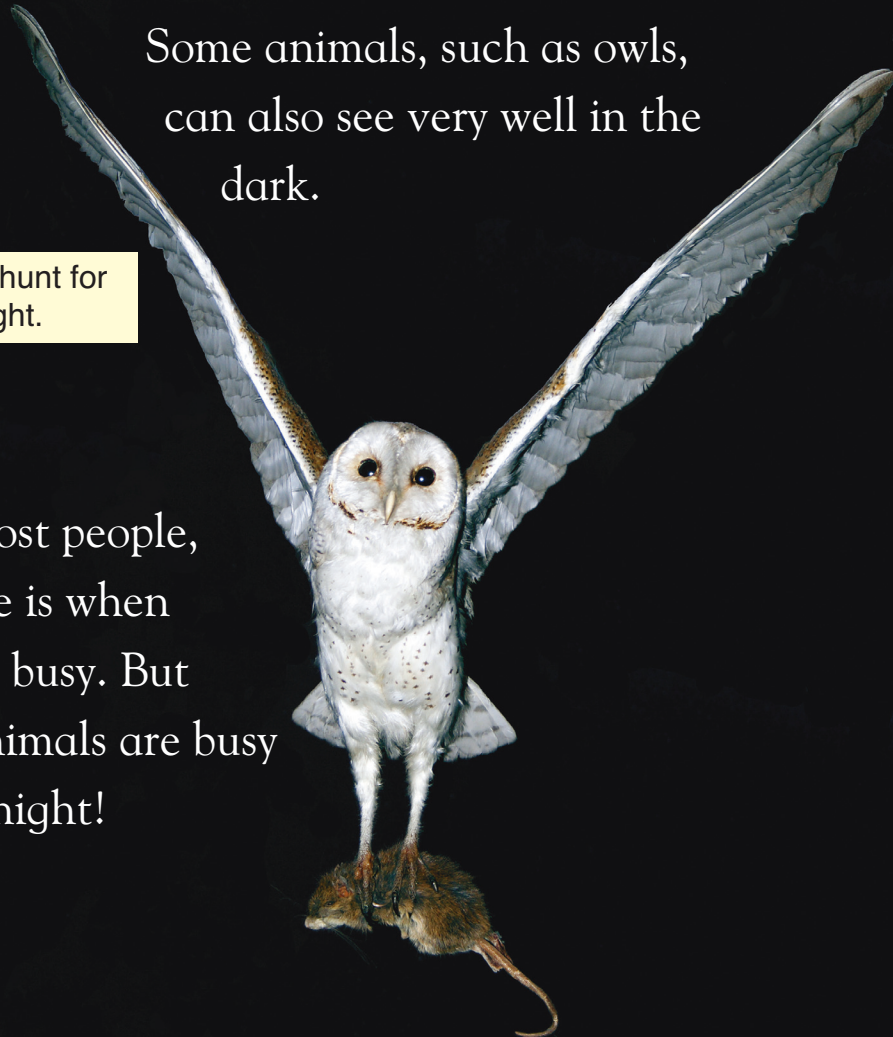


Animals that sleep during the day-time need to hunt for food at night. They usually have a good sense of hearing and smell to catch their food.
