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# Skipper Kipper and the Treasure Chest



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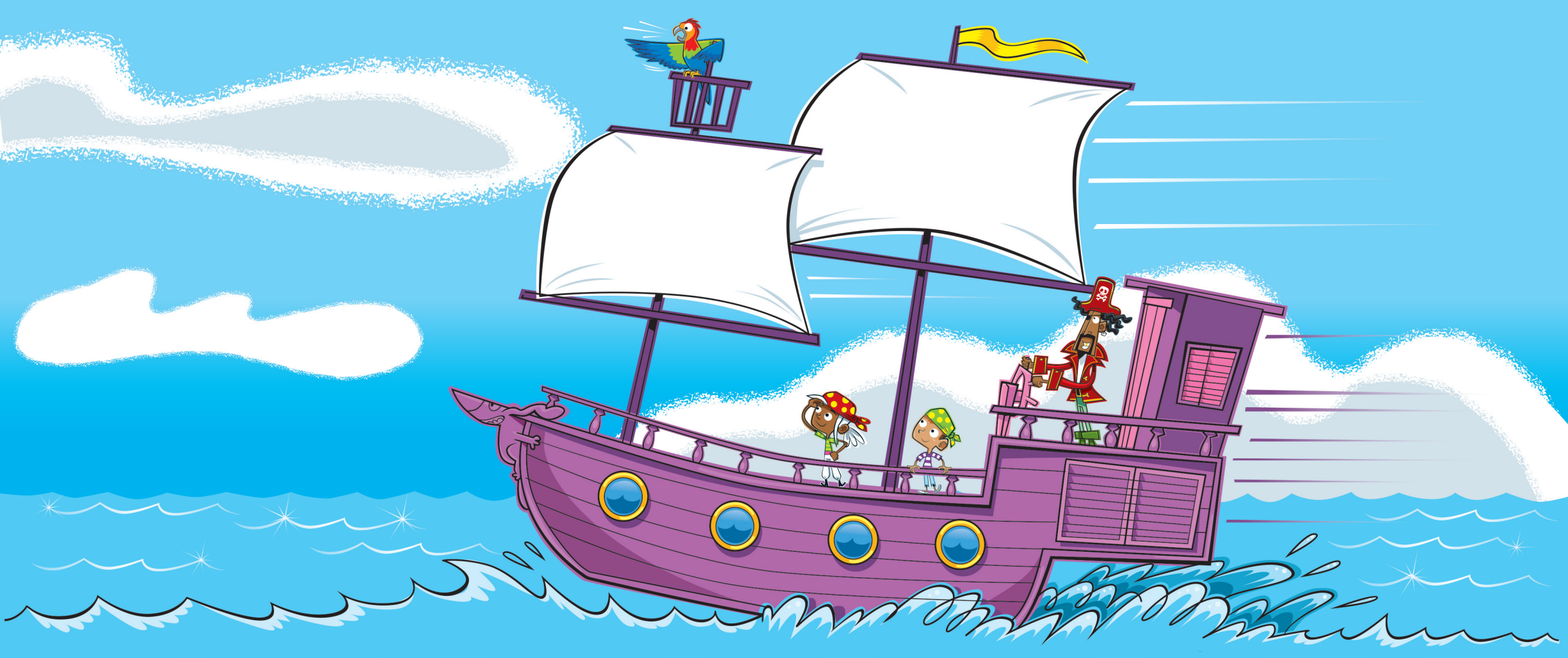
Skipper Kipper jumped onto the deck of his ship, the Daft Dog.

Kipper looked up. Claw, the scarlet macaw, was perched high on the crow's nest. She was pointing into the distance.



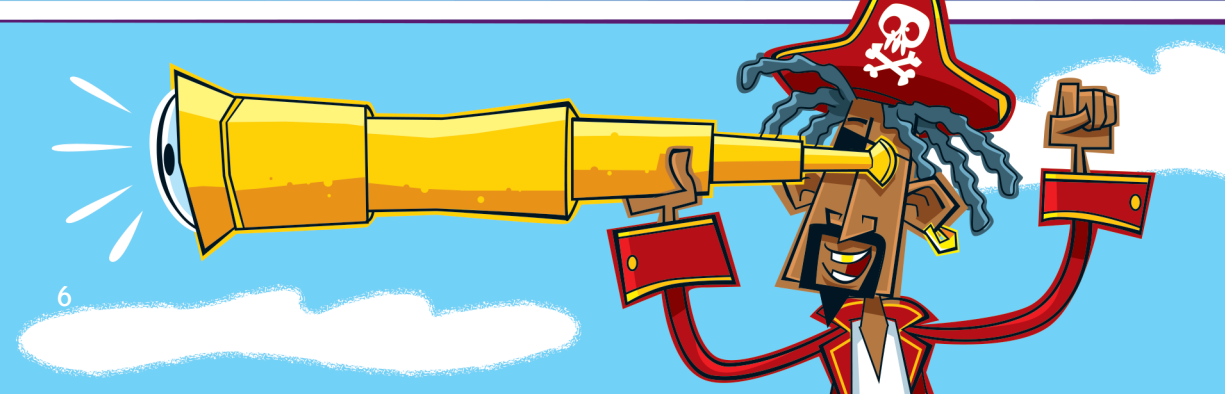
Lily quickly nipped up the rigging to join her.
