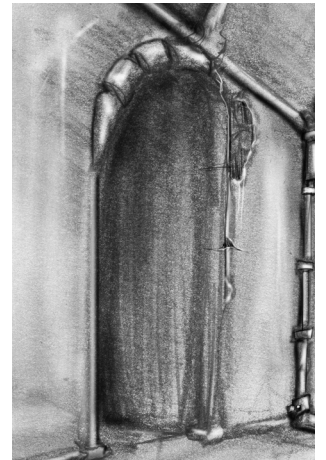

He steps with great care.



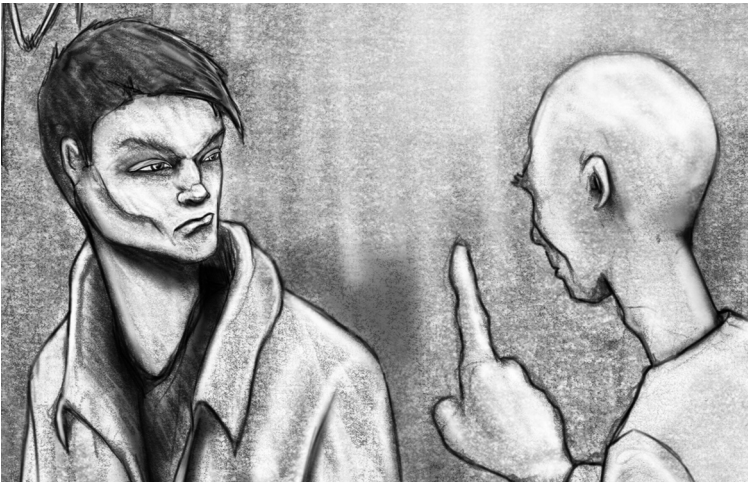
The Dark Man looks for a magic flame.

Chapter Two: The Boy

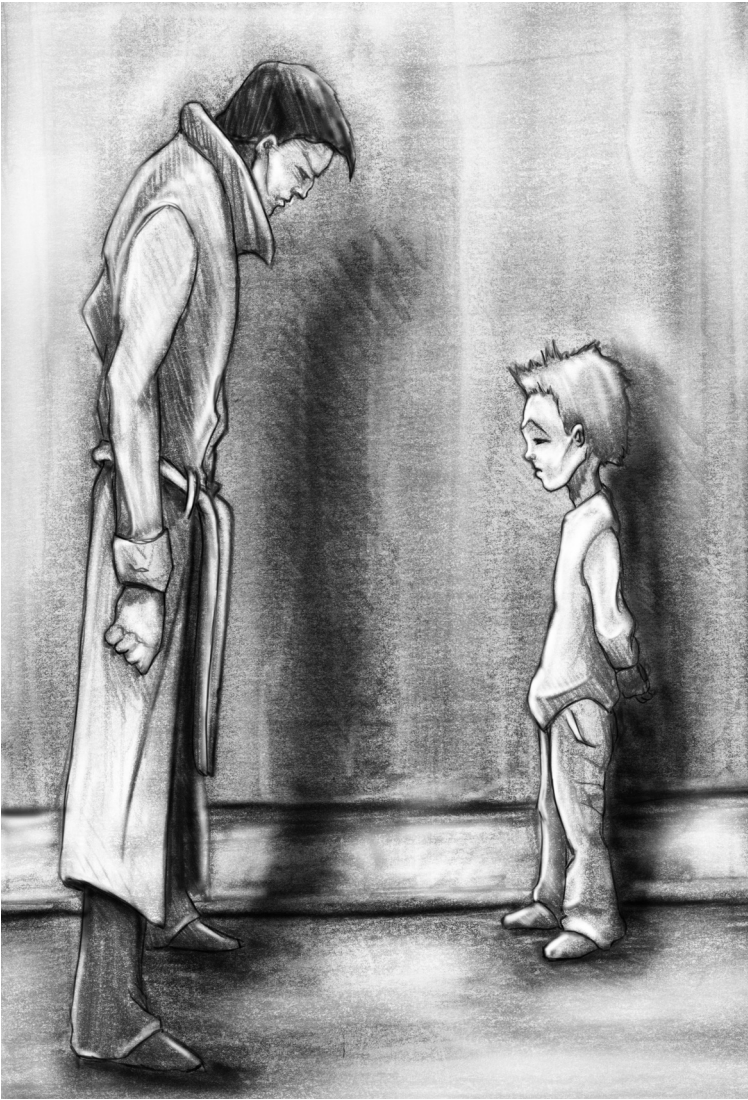
The Dark Man hears a secret word.

He stops.

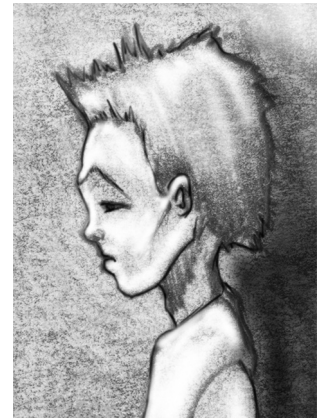
The Old Man said it was down here.
